Thoughts from Ian...

<u>God gives you</u> <u>a new name</u>

Alissa and I are excited to announce that our new baby boy was born on Thursday, March 21 at 8:45am. He was 21.5 inches long and weighed 8lbs 7.8oz. What is his name? That is a good question! Picking a name was a long process. One reason for this is because a name is an important thing. It will be with him for the rest of his life. And, as I have said before, we believe that there are many rules to follow when picking out a good name. Even when we had picked out a name, we wanted to see him before we finally settled on it. This whole process reminded me that I believe that God has chosen a name for you and me.

In the Bible in the book of Isaiah, God says that He will give His people a new name. For example, in Isaiah 62:2, God says that out of His own mouth He will give His people a new name. In Isaiah 65:15, God says that He will give his servants a new name. God gave Sarai the new name, Sarah. He gave Simon the new name of Peter. And he will give you a new name.

In Revelation 2:17, God reminds us of this truth. Jesus encourages those in Pergamum to remain faithful witnesses in a city deeply influenced by Satan. He does this by telling them that in the next life He will give each of them a white stone with a new name written on it. The white stone probably references the white stones that were given to guests of a feast as their token, or ticket, of entry. And what a grand feast we are invited to attend, the great wedding feast of the Lamb (Revelation 19:6-9)!

The new name written on the stone is *your* new name. When you were born, you were given a name by your parents. From what they knew of you, they

gave you a name. But now you are a new creation in Jesus Christ. 2 Corinthians 5:17 says "Therefore, if anyone is in



Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" God, your heavenly Father, knows you most of all and will give you a new name appropriate to you being a new creation. I don't know your name will be but you will find out on your ticket to the heavenly feast. What a wonderful mystery!

There is one name that I *can* tell you- the name of my new son. His name is Henry Joseph Ferguson. Henry after his grandfather on my side. In Judaism, the tradition of naming a son after a grandfather was common as far back as the 5th century BC. His middle name, Joseph, is after his mother's middle name, Jo. Joseph means "he will add" and God certainly added a sweet little boy to our family. All praise to God!

Be encouraged that, because of faith in Jesus, you are a new creation. God has invited you

> to the wedding feast of the Lamb, in His grace to you. God knows you intimately and has given you a new name - a new identity! The old has gone, the new has come.

Session Highlights

At the March 19 Session meeting, elders:

*spent most of the meeting going over Pastor Ian's Pastor Evaluation. The Personnel elder, Bud Koenig, had distributed forms to elders at the February meeting to solicit comments and ratings on various areas of pastoral responsibilities on a 1-5 scale. Bud had consolidated those comments into one report, and he led a discussion at this meeting about that report. The review comments elicited an excellent discussion about both the work of the pastor and the work of the church. The Personnel committee will continue to work with Pastor Ian at their monthly meetings to address ideas brought up in the review for the pastor and for the church, as well as hopes and visions that Ian has for the church in the coming years. The Finance and Personnel committees will meet to recommend salary now that the one-year review is complete. The next Pastor Review will be in Fall, 2019 to get both review and salary increases back on a calendar year schedule.

*noted that Pastor Ian is using his first week of vacation for 2019 for the week of Baby Ferguson's birth. Sunday, March 24, Pastor Matt Ferguson (Ian's dad) will preach, with Ian leading the service, as well as teaching Sunday School and giving the Wednesday Lenten evening message. Elders agreed to pay the regular pulpit supply rate to the new grandpa. This plan was approved via email between the February and March meetings.

*heard that Pastor Ian will be attend a meeting at Gateway Church in Findlay on March 28. This is a first get-together of pastors from several EPC churches in the northwest Ohio area to experiment with such a collaboration.


*approved a contract with E. Lee Construction, Delphos, OH, to do the brick restoration and sealing for \$40,230. A portion of the larger chimney will have bricks removed down several feet, and these bricks will be the source of matching brick for repairs, with the remainder of the chimney being capped off. The cost will quite likely range upwards once work begins and the damage is seen up close, but is anticipated to stay well within the budgeted amount. Work will be done in late June or early July. Thanks to Bud and the Property committee for all the research and work with the contractor to reach this point.


